CHARTER

Missouri Association of Local Boards of Health

Purpose. The Missouri Association of Local Boards of Health (MALBOH) is an organization comprised of community leaders responsible for the governance of local public health agencies. The purpose of MALBOH is to serve mutual interests of its members in the areas of training, professional networking, and policy analysis.

Membership. MALBOH membership is open to any past or current person who serves or has served in a governance role or on an appointed advisory board for a city, county, multi-county or city-county public health agency within the State of Missouri.

Governance. MALBOH is led by a Steering Committee (SC) of up to 15 members elected by the general membership; a Leadership Team carries out the duties of MALBOH as delegated by the Steering Committee. The 5-member Leadership Team includes the President, Vice President (Membership and Communication), Vice President (Professional Development), Vice President (Policy Analysis) and Secretary-Treasurer.

Affiliation. MALBOH is affiliated with the Missouri Association of Local Public Health Agencies (MoALPHA) and the National Association of Local Boards of Health (NALBOH). All members of MALBOH receive many of the benefits of MoALPHA membership, including discounts on educational materials/programs, newsletters, etc.

Formation. With staff support from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services and MoALPHA, a Formation Committee is coordinating development plans for MALBOH's first years. Oversight will transfer to the Steering Committee in Fall of 2008 and be maintained as a standing committee of MoALPHA.
